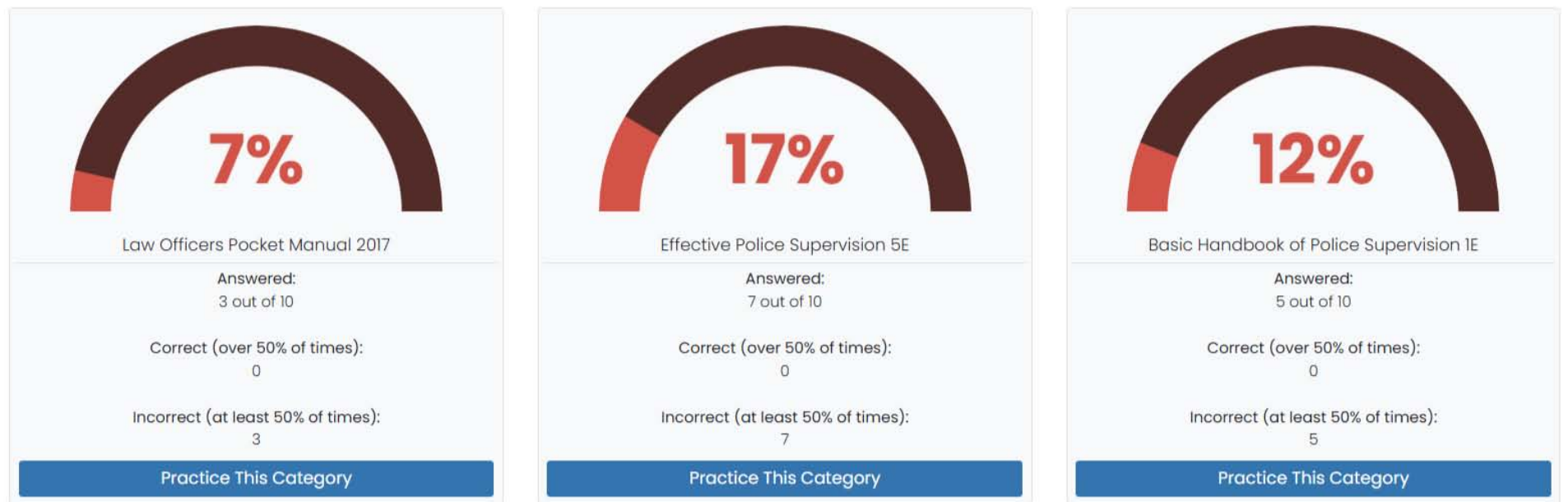

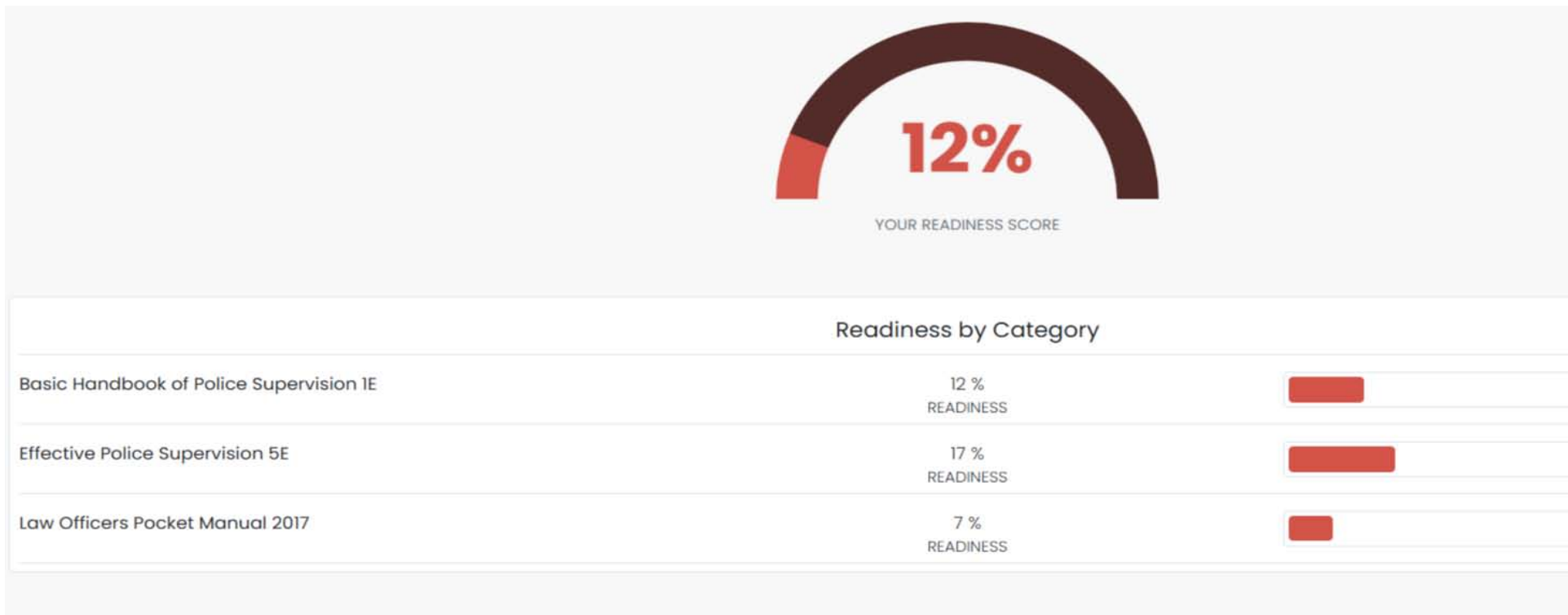

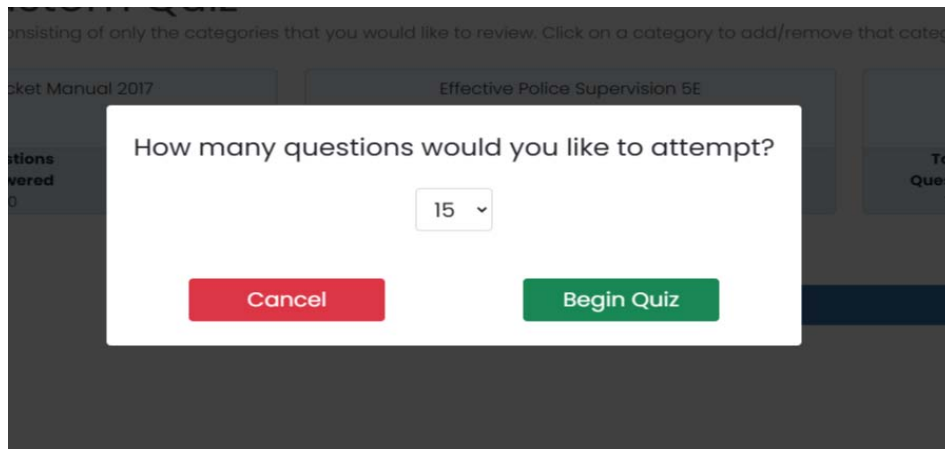

VERY IMPORTANT: Under **MY SCORES** scroll down to **View Your Question History**.

Here, right on the screen, you can review your progress with all the material, as well as **Review the Correct Answer**, and **TAG and UNTAG** any question.

If you are studying only certain chapters of a textbook, **going directly to your Question History screen** you will be able to click on **Toggle Explanation to see the page #** where the question appears, and then **TAG** that question if the page number falls within one of those chapters.
